Climate activism narrowly focused on electrifying our economy and reducing emissions, even if successful in those areas, still leads to ruin. On the other hand, by integrating climate justice and food sovereignty into our climate work, we have the potential to change the playing field itself. This approach can create pathways that circumvent and restructure the systems that created the crises we face. As Audre Lorde famously said, "For the master's tools will never dismantle the master's house. They may allow us to temporarily beat him at his own game, but they will never enable us • to bring about genuine change." We will look at work happening in Louisville, Kentucky, to help illustrate this approach and we will harvest examples of change strategies from participants and examine them through this lens. Finally, we'll consider how to apply

### **COP 26 Climate Talks : PEC Represented by 3 Observers**

This two week conference brings 190 countries together to achieve goals set forth by the Paris Agreement and through the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change. The Paris Agreement, adopted in 2015 at COP21, was adopted by all 196 parties present and primarily focused on limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius. COP26 will review the goals of the Paris Climate
